Col. **Robert Isaac Fleming** (1842-1907) was a notably successful architect-builder in Washington, D.C., who, in the last quarter of the nineteenth century, constructed numerous houses, schools, churches, and office buildings in the city. In fact, one contemporary declared, "He has built more fine houses in this city than any other builder."¹ His papers in this collection, including letters and account books, provide a detailed view of Fleming's business and professional activities during a period of major growth and construction in the capital and also reflect the civic role that Fleming played as a respected, successful Washington businessman.

Fleming was born on January 15, 1842, in Goochland County, Virginia, where he apprenticed as a carpenter. During the Civil War, he served in the Confederate Army, enlisting as a private in the Richmond Fayette Artillery, rising through the ranks, and participating in some thirty battles. In June 1864, his gallantry in the Battle of Cold Harbor won him promotion to the rank of lieutenant. In his later correspondence and charitable contributions, Fleming showed a regard for his Confederate military comrades that continued throughout his life.

After the war's end--and a brief period in Richmond as a carpenter-builder and assistant city engineer--Fleming came to Washington, arriving in 1867. Here he successfully established himself as a builder and developed ties with important Washington political and business figures, most notably with Henry A. Willard, who became his long-time friend and financial backer.

Fleming is known to have been responsible for building at least 127 houses and 34 institutional buildings in Washington (almost all in the Northwest section of the city), although the actual numbers are probably higher. Some of Fleming's projects were designed by other architects; for others, however, he served as both builder and self-taught architect, and the title "architect and builder" was the one he chose for his letterhead. Building projects in which he was involved, in one capacity or another, included the Sumner and Seaton schools in the early 1870s, the British Legation (1872), an addition to the original Shoreham Hotel (at 15th and H Streets, NW), and the Kellogg Office Building (1418-1420 F Street, NW), where Fleming for a time maintained his office. He built showplace houses for some of Washington's most prominent citizens. He also, however, constructed a large number of more modest row houses for the city's growing middle class; many such houses Fleming built on speculation, as rental properties, and he thus became a substantial property owner in the city.

Fleming's civic activities included membership in the District National Guard, which he joined in 1870 and in which he rose to the rank of colonel. He remained, nonetheless, a loyal member of the United Confederate Veterans and donated money for the expansion of the Confederate Soldiers' Home in Richmond. He supported the Little Sisters of the Poor in Washington with both contributions and construction assistance. In 1873 he served an elected term as a member of the District's territorial legislature. Although a businessman and, for a time, president of the Master Builders' Association of Washington, Fleming was a proponent of better working conditions and shorter hours for workers. When, in 1900 and again in 1902, he was proposed for appointment as a District Commissioner, among his strong backers were the city's building trade unions. His candidacy for the commissionership was unsuccessful, but the strong support he received is reflected in correspondence in this collection.

Fleming married Bell Vedder in 1886, and the couple had two children, India Bell Fleming (born in 1887) and Robert Vedder Fleming (born in 1890). They resided at 1018 12th Street, NW (until ca. 1900) and then successively at 1406 Massachusetts Avenue, NW, and 1408 Massachusetts Avenue, NW. In 1893, the Flemings bought the former summer home of President Grover Cleveland, in what is now Cleveland Park, and thereafter divided their time between this home, "Oak View," and their city house. It was at Oak View that Fleming died on September 11, 1907. The page one lead story of that day's Evening Star newspaper noted the passing of "one of the best-known citizens of the District."

Scope and content: The Robert Isaac Fleming Papers, 1856-1906, are arranged in three series:

SERIES I: SCRAPBOOK consists chiefly of correspondence that Fleming mounted in a 76-page scrapbook. There are letters of appreciation for Fleming's work as a builder and for charitable gifts, letters of recommendation written on Fleming's behalf, and letters in support of his appointment to the DC Board of Commissioners in 1900 and 1902. The pages of the scrapbook have been removed from their cover, which is missing. The series also contains items that were found loose in the scrapbook.

SERIES II: CORRESPONDENCE consists of two letter copy books (1883-1884 and 1893-1894) containing pressed copies of Fleming's letters to clients, suppliers, contractors, tenants, city officials and others. In addition, the series contains letters written to Fleming during the periods 1883-1885, 1892-1893, and a few from 1903-1904. Some letters bear Fleming's notes for making reply.

SERIES III: FINANCIAL RECORDS consists of account books documenting Fleming's daily financial transactions. There are two "daybooks" (1876-1882) and four "journals" (1876-1879, 1884-1885, 1885-1888 and 1893-1897) Time books (1889-1891 and 1900) record weekly wage payments made to employees. There are also a small number of invoices and receipts dated between 1883 and 1906.

Folder 1: Scrapbook, pages 1-44 (1856, 1879, 1882-1894) Includes an 1856 letter from Fleming's teacher (p. 1); fourteen letters of introduction and recommendation written for Fleming's 1885 trip to attend a meeting of the Grand Lodge of Masons of Virginia, held in Richmond (p. 7-22); letters of appreciation for charitable donations; letters of commendation and appreciation from clients.

Folder 2: Scrapbook, pages 45-[76] (1898-1902) Includes letters to Fleming, and copies of letters to President McKinley, supporting Fleming as a candidate for the DC Board of Commissioners in 1900 (p. 53-65); a seating chart for a dinner given by Fleming in December 1900, attended by Justice John Harlan, Sen. Julius C. Burrows, Charles Carroll Glover and others, with notes of acceptance and regrets (p. 64 bis-67); letters to Fleming, and copies of letters to President Roosevelt, again supporting Fleming as a candidate for the DC Board of Commissioners in 1902 (p. 69-76) NOTE: Scrapbook pages 50-51 and 58-59 are blank; page numbers 64-65 are duplicated following page 65.

Folder 3: Scrapbook, loose items (1883, 1900-1905 and undated) Includes letters from fellow Confederate veterans (1883) and additional correspondence relating to Fleming's candidacy for appointment to the DC Board of Commissioners in 1900 and 1902.

SERIES II: CORRESPONDENCE

Folder 4: Letter copy book, November 5, 1883-August 22, 1884. Pressed copies of Fleming's outgoing correspondence, in a bound volume of 499 leaves. There is a name index of addressees (reproduced as Appendix 3 of this register). A list of "Letters to Sent. [i.e. Senator] Palmer" (August 12, 1884-December 24, 1885) is inserted. NOTE ON CONDITION: The leaves are very fragile; some are missing. Legibility of many pages is poor because of fading and water staining.

Folder 5: Letter copy book, August 26 (?), 1893-June 9, 1894. Pressed copies of Fleming's outgoing correspondence, in a bound volume of 498 leaves. There is a name index of addressees (reproduced as Appendix 4 of this register) NOTE ON CONDITION: The leaves are extremely fragile; many have crumbled badly; some are missing. For preservation, plastic sleeves protect some leaves; photocopies back others. Legibility of many pages is poor because of paper deterioration.

SERIES III: FINANCIAL RECORDS

Folder 15: Time books, September 7, 1889-August 8, 1891, and July 21-October 6, 1900, reporting weekly wages and hours for Fleming's employees, one week per page. Notebooks list employee names, days worked, daily wage rate, total wages, and work performed, such as hauling ashes, carpentry, brickwork, plumbing, etc., or project on which employed. For example, work done on Fleming's residence at 1018 12th Street, NW, and the 19th Street Baptist Church is included in the 1889-1891 volume. In the 1900 volume, work at Mt. Vernon Seminary is recorded from July 21-August 18, 1900, and work on 1104, 1106, and 1108 M Street, NW, is recorded from August 25-October 6, 1900. The back cover is missing on the 1889-1891 volume.
