



## Legacy Finding Aid for Manuscript and Photograph Collections

**Joseph Forer** (1910-1986) was a Washington D.C. lawyer who, along with his long time partner David Rein, bravely fought for civil liberties during a repressive time period known as the McCarthy Era. Mr. Forer was a native of New Jersey who received his B.A. and M.A. at Rutgers University, and went to Law School at the University of Pennsylvania. He went on to work for the government in the National Labor relations Board and the Office of Price Administration before forming a successful law practice with David Rein in our nation's capital in 1946. Forer and Rein were also founding members of the National Lawyers Guild. Throughout their almost thirty year partnership, Forer and Rein argued more than twenty cases before the Supreme Court, defended hundreds of witnesses before the House Committee on Un-American Activities and the Senate Internal Security subcommittee, and took on cases involving rights of striking workers, the foreign-born, servicemen, and dissenting organizations. A famous case Forer was involved in was the trial of the Giles brothers. They were young black men accused of raping a white woman in Montgomery County, Maryland. They were sentenced to death until Forer stepped in. His appeal resulted in the Supreme Court ordering a new trial and the men were eventually exonerated due to insufficient evidence. Forer and Rein were involved with many more landmark cases like this before Forer retired in 1978. Joseph Forer passed away on June 20, 1986 in Silver Spring, Maryland.

**David Rein** (1940-1979), like his partner Joseph Forer, was also a Washington Lawyer who was an arch defender of civil liberties despite intimidation from the government and the climate of the times. They took on cases that most people were afraid to touch. Rein was a native of New York and received his B.A. and Law Degree from Columbia University. In his early career, he worked for the Puerto Rican Reconstruction Administration, the National Labor Relations Board, and the office of Price Administration. He went on to having a successful career as a lawyer spanning almost forty years. One of the many historic cases Rein was involved in was the Thompson Restaurant case, which eventually brought an end to Jim Crow practices in D.C. After Joseph Forer retired from their practice, Rein joined the firm of Rein, Garfinkle, and Dranitzke. He died on August 11, 1979 of a heart attack.

**Fred Solowey** is a labor journalist as well as a veteran activist in union and international solidarity work. He is a former editor for both the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) and the Teamsters national union magazines. He is also former co-chair of the Washington local of the National Writers Union. He first met and worked with Washington lawyers David Rein and Joseph Forer when serving as executive director of the Coalition to End Grand Jury Abuse in the mid-1970s. Solowey is co-editor of *The New Labor Press: Journalism for a Changing Union* and spent two years researching and interviewing for a book on the law firm of Forer & Rein. The materials in this collection were gathered during that research, but no manuscript resulted.

**Scope and Content:** The Forer and Rein Research Collection, 1941-2001, consists of newspaper clippings, FBI files, correspondence, legal documents, printed materials, literary productions, and research papers relating to the lives and careers of Joseph Forer and David Rein. This collection was gathered by donor Fred Solowey as research material for a proposed book about these two Washington lawyers.

The collection has been kept in the order established by Solowey and is arranged in six series:

**SERIES I: FBI FILES OF JOSEPH FORER** consists of memoranda, legal documents, investigative reports, and other government papers about Joseph Forer. The material is organized by section numbers and is arranged chronologically within the file folders.

**SERIES II: GENERAL FILES** consists of general files concerning Forer and Rein and the cases they were involved in. The files typically contain newspaper clippings, legal documents, correspondence, and other research material. The material is organized by alphabetical order and is arranged chronologically within the file folders.

**SERIES III: CASES** consists of the different cases Forer and Rein were involved in. These include the D.C. Committee for the Bill of Rights, HUAC, The Roger Priest case, SCAB, SISS, and the Thompson Case. This series also includes a file on the Washington Bar and law firms in D.C. The material is organized by cases and is arranged chronologically within the file folders.

**SERIES IV: NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD V. FBI** consists of papers, articles, records, and legal documents concerning the National Lawyers Guild's case vs. the FBI (NLG v. FBI). The material is arranged chronologically within the file folders.

**SERIES V: FBI FILES OF DAVID AND SELMA REIN** consists of memoranda, legal documents, investigative reports, and other government papers FBI Files of David and Selma Rein. The material is organized by topic and by sections. It is arranged chronologically within the file folders.

Series VI: COLUMBIA LAW SCHOOL consists of the research materials Columbia Law interns worked on for the book. It has lists of Forer and Rein's cases and their description, and other papers concerning research for the book. The material is arranged chronologically within the file folders.
